1. Nominees must be academics whose primary activity is teaching in the education discipline. This Award is designed to encourage developing teachers, and will be accepted from fulltime associate lecturers, lectures and senior lecturers, associate professors and professors teaching in undergraduate or postgraduate University courses in the discipline of education.
2. Students' input to the nomination process is strongly encouraged. In such an instance, an academic must submit the entry form.
3. The prize money should be used to further develop the winner's contribution to education teaching. Some suggestions include:
 - Payments towards an overseas trip to attend a relevant education conference
 - Funding the development of a teaching program or software
 - Funding the development of innovative teaching pilots
 - Funding the development of a 'new' teaching project
 - Payment towards attending the ATEA Conference.

INFORMATION ON NOMINATIONS

Submissions must include:

1. A completed nomination form
2. A statement from the nominee addressing the selection criteria
3. A curriculum vitae of no more than four (4) A4 pages outlining the nominee's current position, educational qualifications, career history, teaching positions and teaching experience
4. One reference (of no more than two (2) A4 pages) provided by a person able to comment on the nominee's teaching.

Supporting documentation required:

1. Results of student surveys
2. Selected teaching materials such as subject or course outlines, contributions to curriculum or program design in the Faculty or Department, materials prepared for students, course handouts and study guides.

Submissions plus supporting documentation must not be more than 25 A4 pages. Three (3) copies of submissions and supporting documentation should be sent.

SELECTION CRITERIA

1. Interest and enthusiasm for teaching and for promoting student learning;
2. Ability to organise course material and to present it cogently and imaginatively;
3. Command of subject matter, including the incorporation in teaching of recent developments in the field of study;
4. Provision of appropriate student assessment, including the provision of worthwhile feedback to students on their learning;
5. Professional and systematic approach to teaching development.
6. Participation in professional activities and research relating to teaching.
